HOW AN ETC SYSTEM FUNCTIONS:

- Import and capture member data on the ETC; Name, Date of Birth, Address, Issue Date, Photo, Signature and (optional) Fingerprint Scan and Tribal Enrollment Number.
- Print the ETC on-site and encode the RFID Identifier.
- Transmit, via a secured connection, the ETC information to the Department of Homeland Security.

ETC SYSTEM DESIGNS:

FULL ETC SYSTEM - The full system is on-site under the Nations full control and functionality in the production and issuance of an ETC. The cards are produced and updated as necessary by the Nation.

PARTIAL ETC SYSTEM - A partial system provides for a division of ETC functions between the Nation and the Pascua Yaqui Tribe (PYT). First the ETC data is collected on-site by the Nation. Next the data is sent to PYT, where the cards are produced, and the ETC data is sent to DHS/CBP. Finally the ETC's are returned to the Nation for distribution to their members.

In general, we can consult with you to evaluate your Nations ETC needs and make recommendations on how to meet these needs. Our ETC Service can include the following:

- Develop and design customized ETC forms, informational, brochures, sleeve mailers and operating manuals, policies and procedures.
- Assist with consultation with DHS/CBP in developing Service Level Agreements (SLA) and interconnection Service Agreements (ISA).
- Develop a custom card design that reflects your Nation.
- Assist in the creation of ETC card stock.
- Design a customized ETC System.
- Provide cost estimate in system implementation.
- Train ETC enrollment staff.
- Assist in data collection and capture.
- Transmit ETC Data to DHS/CBP.
- Provide ETC Data Storage.
